Function

The incumbent in this position will furnish full-time nursing duties in the Department of Internal Medicine, Division of Dermatology, at 751 N. Rutledge. This Licensed Practical Nurse will assist the Dermatology physicians in patient care activities in the outpatient clinic and will perform direct patient care requiring elementary nursing principles. This nurse may also assist in other specialties as needed.

Organizational Relationship

The incumbent will report to the Health Care Administrator II who reports to the Health Care Administrator III, in the Department of Internal Medicine.

Duties and Responsibilities

The following information is intended to be representative of the work performed by incumbent in this position and is not all-inclusive. The omission of a specific duty or responsibility will not preclude it from the position if the work is similar, related, or a logical extension of position responsibilities.

I. Clinic Duties 75%

Prepares patients for surgery; obtains surgical permits; administers local anesthetic; prepares surgical tray; and assists physician with procedures.

Assists the physician with patient care (i.e., prepares equipment for diagnosis and treatment, calls patients from the waiting room, obtains vital signs and basic care data, and prepares the patient for the physician's examination or other clinical procedure).

Prepares patients for PUVA treatments, monitors patients during treatments, and discharges patients under direction of the physician.

Provides and coordinates patient education and information, (i.e., explains exam procedures to be performed by the physician and answers questions for patients and their families under physician's direction).

Rotates to assist other physicians as the need arises.

Evaluates medical records for completeness prior to patient visits and obtains missing information.

Reports to and assists RN in acute care and/or episodic minor illness of clinic patients.

Schedules appointments for future patient visits, appointments with other physicians and ancillary services and procedures, and instructs patients accordingly.

Responsible for pre-certification and referrals for managed care patients.

Monitors patient telephone calls and answers applicable questions, determines problems, or redirects call to proper person.

Under direction of physician, orders medication refills and documents action in patient's medical record.

Administers medications IM, dermal, sub-Q, or oral under direction of a physician or RN.

Prepares specific patients for acne cryosurgery.

Prepares patients for chemical peels; performs skin preparation, tray set up and assists physician with the procedure.

Prepares and performs allergy testing, maintains records and mapping of the procedure.

II. Administrative Duties: 25%

Maintains clean well-equipped exam rooms. Keeps track of and orders supplies.

Attends in-service classes and meetings as directed and as deemed necessary. Suggests ideas for in-service training and improving patient education.

Attends scheduled staff meetings.

Copies and transmits Dermatology patient records to other physicians, hospitals, etc.

Knowledge required for the Job

Good communication skills.

Knowledge of clinic policy and procedures.

Responsibility

- A. Supervisory Controls - Supervisory controls are established by the Health Care Administrator II and/or Health Care Administrator III, Department of Internal Medicine.
- B. Guidelines - This person will have access to a procedural manual of clinic procedures and a policy manual and will be given orientation to different specialty procedures per other nursing staff in those specialties.

Difficulty

- A. Complexity -

This practical nurse must adapt to various practice styles of faculty.

This nurse is called upon for a variety of skills which are characterized by sudden change or short notice in order to complete assigned tasks.

This nurse must work in an environment amid constant interruptions.

He/she must possess skills that will enable them to stop a task to complete another task and then return to the first task and complete it.

This nurse must be able to cover more than one doctor at a time when necessary.

- B. Scope and Effect - This nurse is expected to maintain a suitable environment for patients. His/her performance affects patients, faculty and other clinical staff.

Personal Relationships

Personal contact with faculty and staff of clinical departments, community physicians and staff, resident physicians, medical students, patients and their families, local pharmacists, Memorial Medical Center and St. John's Hospital personnel, and pharmaceutical salesmen.

POSSIBLE HAZARDS:

Contact with steam sterilizers.

Contact with occasional infectious patients.
