

## A Brief Look at Southern Illinois University School of Medicine

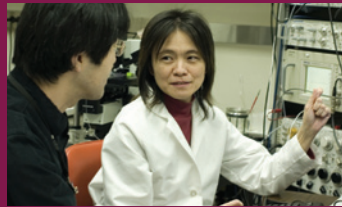
**S**outhern Illinois University School of Medicine is a public-assisted medical school focused on the health care needs of downstate Illinois. We are an international leader in medical education and a key player in the development of the regional academic medical center in Springfield. Since our founding in 1970, we have graduated nearly 2,400 physicians, provided outreach services to dozens of communities, received funding for hundreds of national research projects, and treated thousands of patients.

We work to train caring and competent physicians, to develop new models for providing health care in rural areas, and to provide a clinical practice focused on the health care needs of central and southern Illinois. The School is part of Southern Illinois University Carbondale.

both at St. John's Hospital. Our Center for Family Medicine is located between the two hospitals and Psychiatry offices are a few blocks west of the Rutledge campus.

The Simmons Cancer Institute at SIU, located at the corner of Rutledge and Carpenter in Springfield, offers state-of-the-art treatment for patients in central and southern Illinois as well as facilities for cancer research and physician and public education.

We train students and residents in community hospitals where they have a wide range of clinical experiences. In Springfield, SIU has affiliations with Memorial Medical Center and St. John's Hospital. Agreements also are in place with Carbondale Memorial Hospital and Veterans Administration Medical Center in Marion and hospitals



### FACILITIES

The School's facilities include University-owned structures and leased space in our affiliated community hospitals. In Carbondale, most activities are based in Wheeler and Lindegren Halls, Life Science II and III, and Neckers Building. In Springfield, we are located in 22 buildings. The Medical Instructional Facility at 801 N. Rutledge St. houses many classrooms, laboratories, offices and the medical library. The School shares the adjacent Springfield Combined Laboratory Facility (SCLF) with Illinois' Environmental Protection Agency and Department of Public Health (IDPH). The SCLF Addition houses labs for SIU, IDPH and the Illinois State Police.

Our clinical offices in Springfield are located primarily in the SIU Clinics/Richard H. Moy Building and the Baylis Medical Building, across from Memorial Medical Center, and in the Pavilion and Carol Jo Vecchie Women and Children's Center,

affiliated with our family medicine centers – Blessing in Quincy and Decatur Memorial and St. Mary's in Decatur.

### FUNDING

The School is funded by state appropriations, clinical income, research grants, tuition, service contracts and philanthropic gifts. Our total annual budget (FY11) is approximately \$147.5 million; about 27 percent is from state appropriations.

Philanthropy is critical to ensure continued growth and expansion of our research and educational programs. Private gifts, memorial donations, endowed chairs and contributions make a profound difference in our ability to fund new programs and remain a quality medical school

## MEDICAL EDUCATION

The School of Medicine is internationally recognized for its innovative teaching and testing methods, including the use of simulated patients and courses in medical humanities. We emphasize skills like problem-solving, collegial interaction and lifelong learning.

There are 72 students in each class. First-year students start in Carbondale and sophomores through seniors study in Springfield. Extensive clinical activities in all four years, including experiences in local physicians' offices and hospitals, help students become caring and competent physicians.



Our nationally recognized preparatory program based in Carbondale, MEDPREP (Medical/Dental Education Preparatory Program), provides courses and tutoring for educationally disadvantaged students who show promise. We also offer, in conjunction with SIU School of Law, an M.D.-J.D. dual-degree program.

SIU has residency training programs for physicians in 16 specialty areas -- dermatology, emergency medicine, family medicine, internal medicine, medicine/psychiatry, neurology, obstetrics/gynecology, pediatrics, psychiatry, radiology and six surgery programs including general surgery, orthopaedics, otolaryngology, plastic surgery, urology and vascular. Our graduate programs lead to master's and doctoral degrees in pharmacology, physiology, and molecular biology, microbiology and biochemistry.

## CLINICAL SERVICES

The School of Medicine has more than 260 full-time faculty physicians in seven clinical disciplines – family medicine, internal medicine, neurology, obstetrics/gynecology, pediatrics, psychiatry and surgery. The School partners with hospitals and clinics throughout Illinois to provide specialty and primary care. Our faculty travel to more than 175 outreach sites in nearly 53 Illinois communities.

The School's physicians see patients during more than 367,000 visits to clinical facilities in Springfield and at family medicine centers in Carbondale, Decatur and Quincy. Patient care provided by the physician faculty, a group known as SIU HealthCare, is designed to mesh with the School's educational programs. Patients come from throughout Illinois and the Midwest for the full-range of services, including tertiary-level specialty care.

The Simmons Cancer Institute at SIU offers multidisciplinary cancer clinics, where medical, surgical, psychosocial, and ancillary and support services are available to patients at the same location.

The School's Center for Alzheimer Disease and Related Disorders Memory and Aging Network works with community-based providers throughout the state. St. John's Children's Hospital in Springfield, a joint endeavor with St. John's Hospital, combines SIU's faculty resources with the hospital's pediatric facilities and services. The Southern Illinois Trauma Center (SITC) is a cooperative effort of Memorial Medical Center, St. John's Hospital and the School of Medicine.

## RESEARCH

Our research covers a wide range of basic and clinical sciences. The expansions of the Springfield Combined Laboratory Facility and the Simmons Cancer Institute at SIU enable us to conduct more research benefiting the region.

Currently more than 250 research projects funded by outside resources are underway in 100-plus laboratories. The School's research has grown to \$31.7 million (FY10), with about two-thirds funded by federal agencies such as the National Institutes of Health. Other support comes from health associations, pharmaceutical companies and private foundations.

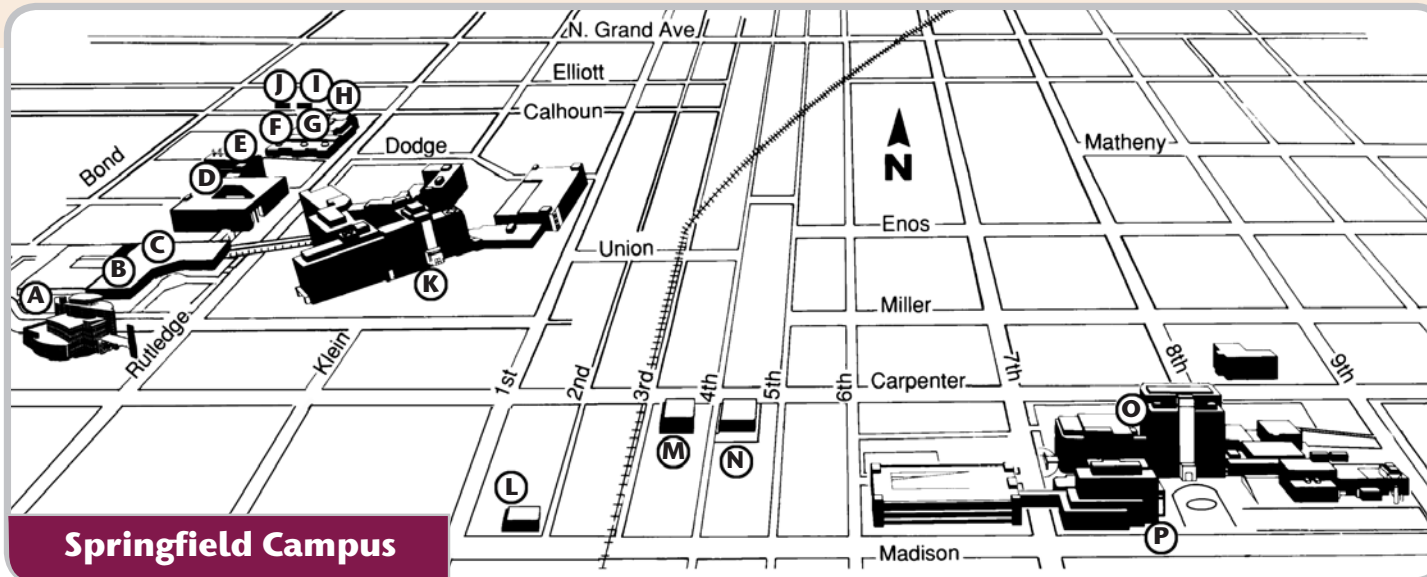
The Simmons Cancer Institute at SIU is focusing its efforts on established and cutting-edge cancer research and treatment as well as physician training and public education for citizens of central and southern Illinois. Researchers are emphasizing the study of basic mechanisms of cancer,

cancer epidemiology in rural areas and translational research bringing new treatments to the bedside.

## SPECIAL SERVICES

Many of the School's programs impact the quantity and quality of health care available in Illinois.

- Continuing medical education programs are offered for physicians and other health care providers.
- An extensive medical library enables the medical community to access resources both on site or online.
- The Pearson Museum collects, displays and interprets the history of medicine, pharmacy and health care.
- The School's Rural Health Initiative program has developed nearly 90 downstate partnerships since 1994.
- Physicians and others collaborate through our telehealth network, which connects dozens of medical facilities.
