Southern Illinois University School of Medicine will graduate 74 new physicians at its sixth commencement exercises Sunday, June 8. The ceremony will begin at 3 p.m. at the Prairie Capital Convention Center.

The commencement address will be delivered by the Honorable Paul Simon, U.S. Representative from Illinois' 24th District. Congressman Simon has been in government for over two decades beginning with election to the Illinois House in 1954 when he was a 25-year-old newspaper editor. After eight years in the Illinois House and six years in the Senate, he was elected Lt. Governor of Illinois in 1968. He has been elected to the U.S. House of Representatives in 1974, 1976, and 1978.

Deane R. Doolen, assistant dean for student affairs, will present the class for degrees. SIU Acting President Hiram H. Lesar, J.S.D., will confer the degrees upon the 74 candidates while Richard H. Moy, M.D., dean and provost of the School of Medicine, will award them their diplomas.

Following the tradition established by the first class in 1975, the Class of 1980 has honored three individuals by selecting them to participate in the ceremonies. J. W. Roddick, Jr., M.D., professor and chairman of obstetrics and gynecology, will read the Hippocratic Oath. Robert E. Merrill, M.D., professor of pediatrics, will hood the graduates as they receive their degrees. Ephraim Fischhoff, D. Soc. Sci., a professor of humanities at Sangamon State University who has been a visiting professor in SIU's Department of Medical Humanities, will deliver the invocation.

David R. Ade of Moline, chairman of the class, will deliver remarks on behalf of the graduates following Congressman Simon's address.

Music during the ceremony will be provided by the SIU School of Medicine Symphony Orchestra conducted by Elizabeth Ricketts. Members of the class of 1981 will serve as ushers.

A reception for all guests will follow at the Springfield Hilton.
