990 residents and fellows have completed training  
273 current residents and fellows are in training (includes 54 in affiliates)

839 MEDPREP alumni; 632 (75.3%) minority; 433 (51.6%) women  
74 current MEDPREP students; 69 (93.2%) minority; 51 (68.9%) women
