- 1.0 Approval of Minutes** - The minutes from the December 21, 2009 meeting of the Doctoring Committee were approved with one revision. Item #3.0, Senior CCX was changed to read "Students must pass 10 of 14 cases."
- 2.0 Announcements**
Dr. Rull commended Dr. Klamen and all involved for the success of the "Teaching and Learning" Symposium held on Feb. 2, 2010.
- 3.0 EPC Update**
Dr. Klamen informed the group that details are being ironed out to allow students to tape lecture sessions and post them.
- 4.0 Curriculum Reports**
4.1 Y1 – Mattie White previously proposed that the OCP scoring form be modified for Y1 by removing "Briefly summarize pertinent facts of the case." Dr. Rull stated it is an important piece of the form and is consistent with other years. It may need to be reworded in order to clarify the expectation. Dr. Klamen recommended sharing a gold standard example

with students perhaps in a narrated power point format or built into Year 1 and Year 2. Valerie Roth explained that this activity is currently included in Doctoring week. The issue will be tabled until Dr. White is present.

4.2 Y2 – Dr. Rull reported that the NMB unit is going well into the second half. Mary Aiello stated that Y2 will begin on Aug. 9, 2010 for the upcoming year.

4.2a Dr. Rull stated that he and Dr. Nelson, Dr. Hoffman, and Dr. Klamen met regarding the Y2 pelvic exams. Currently students have 2 separate sessions during the year (one mandatory and one optional). Due to financial constraints, there will only be one offering next year. The session will occur in Doctoring Week and will be coordinated with OB faculty. If a student requests further practice, this can be coordinated on an individual basis.

4.2b Dr. Rull informed the group that the Intimate Partner Violence PAC held Jan. 13, 2010 was successful. Evaluation results were shared. Luke Freiburg MS2 stated that he received positive feedback from other Y2 students regarding the PAC.

4.2c Dr. Rull shared evaluation results from the Health Literacy PAC held on Feb. 10, 2010. Luke reported that students tended to like the IPV session better and that they had not put much thought into health literacy issues. Dr. Rull informed the group that Dr. Francis will be relocating to Texas mid-March. She coordinates the Health Literacy PAC as well as the Patient Safety PAC. Doctoring is seeking someone to coordinate these sessions for next year. Ross Silverman has volunteered to co-lead the Patient Safety PAC. Dr Rull stated that if no one from the Doctoring Committee is able help, general faculty will be consulted. Faculty mentioned that may be interested in co-leading this session include: Dr. Todd, Dr. Sattovia, Dr. Brenner, and Dr. McDowell.

4.2d Incorporating palliative care into EOL PAC. Ross Silverman and Dr. Hingle were not present so this item will be tabled for the second time

4.2e The Doctoring committee is awaiting a replacement faculty member from Medical Humanities to take the place of Dr. Bhattacharya who recently relocated.

6.0 Incorporating Diagnostic reasoning into the CCX case.

Dr. Klamen led an informative discussion regarding the open text question that will be added to the CCX long case regarding clinical reasoning. Students have been notified by the EPC student representative. Valerie Roth commented that it is preferable to have the question built in all throughout the CCX instead of at the end. Dr. Klamen will be grading Y2 and Y4 responses the first time around.

The score weighting will need to be determined. No summer remediation course will be offered this year.

7.0 Geriatrics Initiatives

Due to logistical and financial reasons, Springfield faculty will not be traveling to Carbondale to provide the Geriatrics program in Y1. Y1 faculty will be coordinating this.
