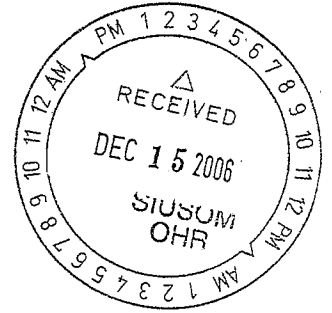


POSITION DESCRIPTION

RANK: Assistant (Associate) Professor of Clinical Psychiatry

DEPT/DIVISION: Department of Psychiatry, Adult Outpatient Services

GENERAL DUTIES:

The incumbent will function as a faculty member in the Department of Psychiatry, Division of Adult Outpatient Services, and will report to the Director of Adult Outpatient Services. The incumbent will be primarily responsible for direct patient care activities with psychiatric outpatients at the SIU Behavioral Health Center, as well as circumscribed inpatient duties at Memorial Medical Center and St. Johns Hospital in Springfield, IL. Academic duties include active participation in the development and delivery of instructional activities to medical students, residents and allied health professionals, as well as research functions related to specialty interest and expertise.

CHARACTERISTIC DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

85% Clinical Service

- Maintain a clinical practice in accordance with SIU Physicians & Surgeons' requirements and departmental needs.
- Participate in outpatient clinics as negotiated with outpatient director.
- Participate in the departmental on-call schedule.
- Provide coverage for the inpatient service 3 months of each year

5% Teaching

Participate in residency and medical student clerkship training programs as required by departmental needs. This will include, but is not limited to, supervision of residents and medical students in outpatient clinics and inpatient rotations.

5% Research

- Publish as author or co-author in a peer-reviewed journal every two years.
- Collaborate with clinical research projects in the department.

5% Administration/Professional Services

- Serve on departmental / school committees as required and represent the department as needed to other organizations.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

1. Must have an M.D. / D.O. degree.
2. Must have completed four years of an ACGME or AOA-approved residency training program in psychiatry and be board certified / eligible per requirements of the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology.
3. Must be licensed to practice in the State of Illinois.
4. Privileged in electroconvulsive therapy, or willingness to obtain such privileges.

ADDITIONAL QUALIFICATIONS:

Special interest or expertise in women's health issues, consultation-liaison / psychosomatic medicine, geriatrics, forensic psychiatry, or developmental disabilities are considered desirable.
