### GENERAL DUTIES:

The incumbent will function as a faculty member in the Department of Psychiatry, Division of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry and will report to the Chief of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry. The incumbent will be primarily responsible for direct patient care activities with psychiatric outpatients at the SIU Behavioral Health Center, as well as circumscribed inpatient duties at Memorial Medical Center, St. Johns Hospital or Springfield Behavioral Health (PSI) in Springfield, IL. Academic duties include active participation in the development and delivery of instructional activities to medical students, residents and allied health professionals.

### CHARACTERISTIC DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

#### 70% Clinical Service

- Maintain a clinical practice in accordance with SIU Physicians & Surgeons' requirements and departmental needs.
- Participate in outpatient clinics as negotiated with the Division Chief.
- Participate in the departmental on-call schedule.
- Provide coverage for the inpatient service as requested.

#### 20% Teaching

Participate in fellowship, residency and medical student clerkship training programs as required by departmental needs. This will include, but is not limited to, supervision of fellows, residents and medical students in outpatient clinics and inpatient rotations.

#### 5% Research

- Publish as author or co-author in a peer-reviewed journal every two years in the area of child and adolescent psychiatric research.

- Collaborate with clinical research projects in the department.

**5% Administration/Professional Services**

- Serve on departmental / school committees as required and represent the department as needed to other organizations.

**MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:**

1. Must have an M.D. / D.O. degree.
2. Must have completed four years of an ACGME or AOA-approved residency training program in General Psychiatry and a Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Fellowship.
3. Must be board certified/board eligible by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology in General Psychiatry and Child and Adolescent Psychiatry/
4. Must be licensed or eligible for licensure to practice in the State of Illinois.
