

## **Springfield Campus Psychiatry Seminar Series**

During the psychiatry clerkship you will be exposed to a variety of teaching methods during seminars ( e.g. paper cases, SPs, live patients). We ask that all students prepare prior to the scheduled sessions.

Mandatory attendance of seminars is a part of the clerkship curriculum. A detailed listing of these is included in the Calendar of Activities. There are required readings from the Andreasen/Black textbook for most sessions. Please read these assignments prior to the seminar.

To prepare, please do the following:

- Read the chapter(s) from the Andreason/Black textbook that correspond to the seminar. These chapters are indicated on the Calendar of Activities Schedule that lists the dates, times, and other relevant details.
- Be prepared to interview a patient and present the findings.
- Be prepared to discuss the following:
  - Disorder classifications and subtypes
  - Epidemiology
  - Etiology
  - Pathophysiology
  - Course and Outcome
  - Diagnostic Criteria
  - Clinical Findings
  - Differential Diagnosis
  - Clinical Management

As a general rule, the following sessions will use a real patient, SP or a video tape of a patient:

- Anxiety Disorders
- Mood Disorders
- Geriatrics
