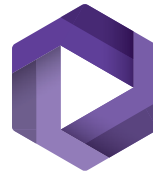

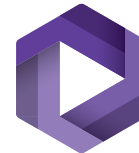

JOIN THE ALTON FAMILY MEDICINE RESIDENCY PROGRAM

The city of Alton is as rich in charm as it is history. Incorporated in 1837, Alton is best known for being the home of Robert Wadlow (the world's tallest man) and abolitionist publisher Elijah P. Lovejoy, the birthplace of jazz legend Miles Davis, winner of the reality program Small Business Revolution and supporter of many local entrepreneurs.

The Alton Family Medicine Residency is the first of its kind in the area with unwavering support from Alton Memorial Hospital and the Southern Illinois Healthcare Foundation. Our program brings resident physicians to an enthusiastic community in need of more family physicians, and our community physicians and other care providers enjoy teaching and practicing alongside the next generation of Family Medicine physicians.

OUR CURRICULUM

Residents experience block rotations across a 3-year curriculum that maximizes exposure to diverse patient populations and settings.

Residents will also receive training in:

- Inpatient Pediatrics rotations at St. Louis Children's Hospital

- Plastic Surgery
- POCUS
- Practice Management
- Procedures (inpatient and outpatient)
