The Matthew Project (TMP) is an afterschool academic and mentoring program available to homeless children in District 186. On Thursdays, the children receive a hot meal, one-on-one tutoring and participate in life skills activities.

The 12 children currently enrolled in TMP are a part of 7 families and they all have siblings with needs (see page 3)

We plan on going over to the TMP building as a group the second Thursday in April (April 9th) to hand out gift baskets with a special presentation to the kids about what doctors do.
