As you are aware, an earthquake struck Nepal on April 25, 2015. Its epicenter was the village of Barpak in the Ghorka district. More than 7,000 people died and twice as many were injured. A second major earthquake hit on May 12, 2015, killing 42 and injuring over 1,000 people.

Recipes

Pineapple Jello Cake (Vidhya Prakash's mom got the recipe for this delicious, easy to make cake from a newspaper):

Preheat oven to 350°. Grease a 9X12 inch cake pan. Mix following in a large bowl: 1 box yellow cake mix, 4 eggs, 3/4 cups vegetable oil, 20 oz crushed pine-apple, 1/2 packet orange jello, 1/2 packet pineapple jello. Pour into pan and bake for 1 hour.
