Lead Presenter: Officer Nathan Schwiethale

Officer Nathan Schwiethale has spent 17 years with the Wichita Police Department. In 2013, he brought the Homeless Outreach Team (H.O.T.) program to Wichita, which has taken over 800 homeless off the streets and into permanent or transitional housing.

H.O.T. was recognized by the United States Interagency Council on Homelessness as being a best practice in law enforcement and Officer Schwiethale was recently added to the federal government's Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration advisory board to draft training materials for other police agencies across the nation that want to adopt a H.O.T. program. H.O.T. was also recognized by the Department of Justice for decriminalizing homelessness and listed as a best practice on their COPS website.
