THE RULES!



Deferral Policy

Except in special circumstances, students may not defer third-year clerkships, but must take them as scheduled in the regular rotation. Approval of a request to defer a clerkship is granted by the Associate Dean for Student Affairs. It is recommended that any such request be submitted to the Office of Student Affairs at least four weeks prior to the start of the Core Clerkship. Deferred Core Clerkships will be scheduled during the Personalized Education Plan period of the third year when possible.

This policy guides procedures and expectations around granting student requests to defer the start of Year 3 core clerkships. All students must sit for USMLE Step one prior to starting clerkships.

Students who are not enrolled in Summer Remediation are discouraged from deferring clerkships. Requests for any deferrals must made through consultation with the Dean of Students.

- <u>Students who wish defer one clerkship</u> will be allowed to make up the clerkship during the PEP. They may request a deferral through the Dean of Students.
- All students deferring 2 or more clerkships will be referred to the Y3SPS for specific recommendations about their 4th year requirement.
 - <u>Students who defer 2 clerkships</u> will be allowed to make up both clerkships during the PEP, but will also be required to complete at least one additional 4-week Intensive Clinical Experience during their Y4 in order to graduate with a sufficient background in clinical medicine. Additional requirements may be recommended by the Y3SPS.
 - <u>Students who defer more than 2 clerkships</u> must submit a request in writing to the Y3SPS after consultation with the Dean of Students. Students will be allowed to make up two deferred clerkships during the PEP. These students will be required to complete at least one additional 4-week Intensive Clinical Experience during their Y4 in order to graduate with a sufficient background in clinical medicine. Additional requirements may be recommended by the Y3SPS.

The deadline for these requests is one week before the June Meeting of the Y3SPS.

• An SPC vote is needed to approve any deferral requests made by students who are on Academic Probation.



• NO INTERVIEWING DURING MED HUM / Doctoring Week

• SCHEDULE INTERVIEWS FOR VACATION TIME (15 wks)...

Interview Time Off requests are not guaranteed in an elective; if it can be granted you may be required to make up the time for the absence.



Time Requirements in Y4

46.0 weeks= Time available in Y4-30.0 weeks= Required Elective Credit(20 On-Campus Credit)
Additional weeks may be required of deferral students- 1.0 week= Required MED HUM / DOC Clerkship

15 weeks = Open Time

PITFALLS TO AVOID

Prerequisites:

- Notify faculty "X" weeks before
- "Successful completion of"
- Not checking these things and following through may cause you last minute changes or inadvertently cause you to be dropped from the course

Absences / Time Off:

- Communicate! If you need time off or have an unplanned absence for an elective, discuss with faculty far in advance, come with a plan to make it up.
- No absence line in Y4, work with course faculty and staff directly.
- Holidays No guaranteed
 Holidays in Y4

They are at the discretion of the faculty.

PITFALLS TO AVOID



- Retake elective only with permission / No waiting list
- Graduation Requirements
- Evaluations: No credit is awarded until done

YOUR RESPONSIBILITY!



PITFALLS TO AVOID



- Satisfactory with decreased weeks of credit
- Incomplete (must be completed before April—or converts to Unsatisfactory)
- Unsatisfactory-stays on transcript and triggers review by most medical licensing boards (ie. delays licensure for residency and practice each time you apply!)



ELECTIVES 30 Weeks of Credit

- 20 Weeks On-Campus Credit
 - Additional weeks may be required of deferral students
- 12 Weeks of "Core" Credit
 - 4 Weeks each in 3 Core Clinical Departments
 - (EM, FCM, IM, OBGYN, NEURO, PEDS, PSYCH & Surgery)
- 1 (4-week rotation) ICE* from the list
 - Additional ICE may be required of deferral students
- 4 Weeks of Basic Science Elective
- *ICE <u>CAN</u> count toward 1of 3 "Cores"



Vary in Length:

- •Full time (1 credit for each week)
- •Half-Time: AM/PM (0.5 credit for each week)
- Extended (consecutive Thursday PMs) (1 block = 5 weeks = 0.5 credit)

Individually-Designed Electives

 IDE -- Not in the Catalog – something YOU design

Extramural Electives

"Away" Electives – other LCME schools

 Electives requiring travel to foreign countries will not be added to your schedule until you have completed a required meeting with the Associate Dean for Student Affairs <u>AT LEAST six weeks</u> prior to the start date. No credit will be given if this requirement is not fulfilled by the deadline.
