What is a Community Health Worker (CHW)?

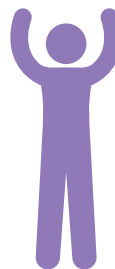
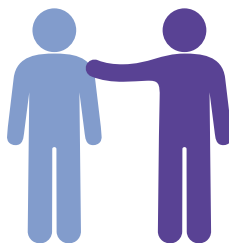
A Community Health Worker is a trusted public health worker who understands the needs of the community they serve.
