# WHEN BREATH BECOMES ALL PAUL KALANITHI

### **Good Reads**

Kalanithi, Paul. When Breath Becomes Air. New York: Random House, 2016.

In his #1 New York Times bestselling memoir, *When Breath Becomes Air*, Dr. Paul Kalanithi wrestles with some of life's most difficult questions: What makes life worth living? What makes a virtuous life? What do you do when your future is "flattened into a perpetual present?"

At the age of 36, and on the verge of completing a postdoctoral fellowship in neuroscience at Stanford University, Dr. Kalanithi was diagnosed with stage IV lung cancer. His memoir reflects back on his personal transformation from medical student, to neurosurgeon, and finally to a patient confronting his own mortality. Beautifully written, and profoundly moving, When Breath Becomes Air is an outstanding work from a clearly brilliant mind.
