INCOMING MEDPREP STUDENTS' GUIDE TO REGISTERING FOR CLASSES ~ 2020 EDITION

Welcome to the SIU School of Medicine MEDPREP program. This guide will help you get started with registration. It also includes course information for both summer and fall registration.

OVERVIEW

Registration is online, and as a student, you are required to complete your registration (your advisor cannot register for you). Each term, you will need a unique number called a Registration User Number (RUN) to register. The RUN is different for each student, and changes each semester. You are required to communicate with your advisor prior to registration (via email, phone call, zoom, in person, etc.) to determine your class schedule. Your advisor will then provide you with your RUN number for the term for which you are registering. **NOTE:** For the entire time that you are in MEDPREP, you must always have approval from your advisor before registering AND before making any changes to your schedule. Follow the instructions below to set up your online registration access and get registered.

I. NEW SIUC STUDENTS: USE YOUR DAWG TAG NUMBER TO CLAIM YOUR NETWORK ID

• Registration is completed via the SalukiNet internet portal, and you will need your SalukiNet Network ID and password to enter the secure registration site. Your admission letter from SIUC will have your DAWG tag number on it, which you can use to claim your Network ID and password and start your registration.

To Claim Your NetworkID using your DawgTag Number:

- Go to the SIUC homepage: www.siu.edu
- Click on *SalukiNet* it's in grey letters on the top right.
- Click on the yellow button that says "Register for Your Classes."
- On the sign in page, click on the blue "Don't have an account yet?" link.
- Click on the "New user? Claim your Network ID" link in the login box.
- Follow the instructions to claim your ID and get your password.
- Now your network ID is ready to use. From now on, when you accesss SalukiNet, you'll need use your network ID, which is just "siu" followed by your DawgTag numbers (e.g. siu85XXXXXXX), along with the password you just created.

Lost your DawgTag Number?? Follow the instructions above, but when you get to the first page of the Identity Claim procedure where they ask for your DAWG tag, click on the "Dawg Tag Lookup" link on the bottom left – you'll just need your social security number and your birthdate. (You can also find the Dawg Tag Lookup link on the Registrar office page at registrar.siu.edu).

II. REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS FROM REGISTRAR'S OFFICE

Registration is through the online registration portal. If needed, download the 4-page "Step-by-step Overview of the Registration Process" document from the registrar's office (*visit https://registrar.siu.edu/webreg/*). As an SIU student, you will want to become familiar with the SIUC registrar's page at *registrar.siu.edu*.

III. COURSE REGISTRATION

You will need your unique Registration User Number (RUN) for each semester, which you can <u>only</u> obtain from your MEDREP advisor. If you are not sure who your advisor is, please call Mr. Stevens in the MEDPREP admissions office.

→ You will first register for summer classes, and once that has been cleared by the system, you can register for fall classes. Both will be done BEFORE you start MEDPREP.

Remember: you cannot register without your RUN numbers, so have those handy when you start the registration process. You will need separate RUNs for summer and fall.

A. SUMMER 2020 CLASSES – All students register for 4 credits.

B. FALL CLASSES – Credits will vary depending on individual student.

Most of your classes for fall will be MEDPREP courses, with 1-2 elective courses. Elective courses will vary for each student, depending on each student's academic background, program (traditional MP, MPH-MP or MBS-MP). You will work with your advisor to determine your final fall schedule.

VARIABLE CREDIT COURSES IN FALL REGISTRATION: Some MEDPREP courses have variable credit hours. If this is the case, the credits listed for the course in your current schedule (in the column "Cred") will be a blue hyperlink. You will need to select the correct number of hours (listed in the course table on the next page) by clicking on the credit number and changing it if needed. Clicking on the credit number will take you to the *Change Class Options* menu. Scroll down to the course(s) you need, put in the correct number of units, and click "Submit Changes." Even though you have made the changes, you will need to click "Return to Menu" at the top of the screen to return to the *Registration* menu. If you already registered but need to go back in to change the units during the open registration period, you can go directly to the *Change Class Options* page from the *Registration* menu.

FALL REGISTRATION "BLOCKS"

The SalukiNet registration system runs a number of checks as you are registering, including **prerequisites** completed, and **time conflicts** for course meeting times. MEDPREP students new to SIUC will be seen by the computer as having NO prerequisite courses done, which will result in registration errors when you attempt to register for "campus" (non-MEDPREP) courses in the fall. To fix this, you need to request a prerequisite override from your advisor. Once the override is put in place, then you can register for the class.

Additionally, occasionally there will be time conflicts for MEDPREP courses and MEDPREP Convocation. If you run into this, go ahead and sign up for the MEDPREP course, and request a time conflict override from your advisor for Convocation. Once the override is put into place, then you can register for Convocation.
