The Library's National Library of Medicine 3D printing project printed copies of a CICO Rescue Cricothyroidtomy Trainer (thingiverse model #2530474) to be tested by the Surgical Skills Center and we are learning InVesalius software to construct printable models from CT scans. During September our Library Director, Taran Ley, and Karli White, Instructor, attended a workshop at the 3D Printing Center of Excellence at Cardinal Glennon Children's Hospital in St. Louis and learned how physicians there are using 3D printing to create patient specific models for presurgical planning.
